ABOUT THE EVENT

LIBSEEN stands at the crossroads. Since the network's revival over the past 2 years, discussions have been initiated over the purpose and role of LIBSEEN, the reform of the political structure that is needed to fulfill this purpose and level of organizational capacity to underpin the existing and future framework of regional cooperation.

Key condition for the success of the workshop:

Participants must obtain a mandate from their party bodies to discuss (and VOTE) the long-term and very crucial decisions that will affect LIBSEEN in the coming years. It is recommended that either Steering Committee members or International officer participate in the event.

Partner organizations representatives come with a clear vision of what the network should look like in line with available opportunities for cooperation and funding.

The network is therefore completely <u>hypothetical</u> for this session, but station leaders will most likely put forward the advantageous aspects of their networks so that we conclude with a refined idea of a near-perfect network.

Station 1: Goran Neralić [Policy and Issue Driving]

- What are the policy themes our network should be concerned with?
- In what ways can our network drive issues?

Station 2: Rainer Adam [Organisational Structure and Decision-Making]

- Describe examples network structures which are democratic and efficient for decision making
- What are the rights and roles of members, on one hand, and strategic funding partners on the other, in determining our network's operations?





Station 3: Andrew Burgess [Communication]

- Describe internal and external communication of the network
- What are the channels the network should use to communicate with stakeholders and the public?

Station 4: Luke Akal [Events and Training]

- Discuss our network's flagship event as a gathering of all members and partners. What does this event look like and how is it organised?
- How does the network engage in training and assisting members with capacity development?

Aim: Robust discussions and presentation of outcomes will help to clarify each stakeholder's unique perception of the ideal network. The station discussions and presentations naturally set the tone for lunch and the LIBSEEN afternoon sessions in a friendly, creative way.
